# **SUCCESS – WE'VE GOT THERE!!**


Following all the incredible fund raising efforts by Members, events and most recently the receipt of £500 from the Teddy Bear Festival Fund, we have finally reached our target for the new Toilets Project. In August — after numerous rounds backwards and forwards of questions and answers with Breckland Council, we also managed to get approval to proceed from the Buildings Regulations Department.

As a result, you will now start to see various aspects of the work commencing at the Terrain. Work has already started on getting fresh water connected. After much "divining", digging and then the use of ground penetrating radar by an expert, we finally found the water supply across the Recreation Ground to the Scout Hut. It is this supply that we will be connecting up with. Hopefully the pipe will be laid across to the compound within the next two weeks.

The final big purchase of the sewage treatment plant (STP) has been made and the unit has been delivered into the safe storage at Ray Beales barn.

The responses to Mandy's email to you all for volunteers to help with the work required, have so far been very few. If you can help can we please ask you to get back to Mandy so that we can formulate a plan for the work needed.
